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# Section 1 - Background to Cost Transparency in the UK and Ireland

# Cost Transparency Initiative in the United Kingdom

- The Cost Transparency Initiative (CTI)
  was introduced by the Financial
  Conduct Authority (FCA) in the United
  Kingdom in 2018.
- The CTI was based on recommendations from The Institutional Disclosure Working Group (IDWG) set up by the FCA and chaired by a leading professor of finance, Professor Chris Sier.
- Cost Transparency Initiative (CTI)
   Templates, authored by Professor Sier, were then introduced to enable asset owners or their advisors to require asset managers employed to provide completed CTI templates.
- The CTI templates include all cost information in a standard and prescribed format and at specific client and mandate level.
- Asset managers faced regulatory penalties for failing to provide data or for wilful misrepresentation.
- The primary objective of the Cost Transparency Initiative (CTI) was to enable asset owners and their advisors to assess whether they are receiving value for money on mandates held by managers employed, and for asset managers to understand whether they are delivering competitive outcomes and value for money for clients.

#### **Cost Transparency Standard in Ireland**

- Following the successful model of the Cost Transparency Initiative (CTI) in the United Kingdom, the Irish pensions regulator, The Pensions Authority, has announced the introduction of the Cost Transparency Standard (CTS) in Ireland with the full authority of the Department of Social Protection. <u>Click</u> here to read the announcement.
- Institutional asset owners will participate in the programme and require asset managers employed to complete CTS Templates for every mandate placed with them.
- While compliance with the Cost Transparency Standard (CTS) will be voluntary, The Pensions Authority has made it clear that it expects asset owners to participate and that it will move to formal legislation to mandate participation if necessary.
- The Irish Association of Pension Funds (IAPF) will manage the introduction and implementation of the Cost Transparency Standard (CTS) and will provide access to all information resources including the prescribed CTS Templates.
- The programme is supported by the Irish Association of Investment Managers

## **Section 2 - Cost Transparency Templates**

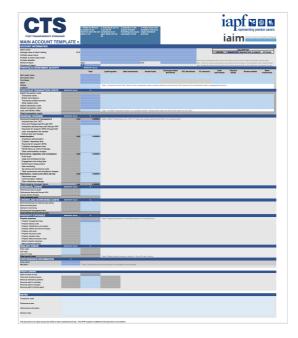
The fields requiring completion in the Cost Transparency Initiative (CTI) and Cost Transparency Standard (CTS) templates are exactly the same, therefore automated processes already established for completion of the CTI Templates in the UK can be transferred to complete the CTS template.

Those completing CTS Templates in Ireland for the first time might find it helpful to speak to your UK counterpart for advice in completing the templates.

### **Section 3 - The Cost Collection Process**

- 1. Asset owners engage ClearGlass to manage the cost collection process on their behalf.
- 2. ClearGlass sends an email request to the asset managers to complete either the CTI or CTS Templates on behalf of the asset owner client.
- 3. The request will include a 'Letter of Authority', which authorises ClearGlass to collect cost and charges information on behalf of the client.
- 4. The asset manager submits the templates by the designated due date\*
- 5. ClearGlass checks and verifies the information supplied, and highlights any errors or data issues, so that these can be rectified before delivery of the report to the client.
- ClearGlass are required to report back to the client on the timeliness of delivery, accuracy of the data provided, and willingness to provide the requested data. Therefore all submissions are rated via the ClearPass Framework (see <a href="https://www.clearglass.com/clearpass">https://www.clearglass.com/clearpass</a> for details).

In certain circumstances, when data will not be available after 12 weeks, a date for delivery can be agreed with the manager and client and communicated to ClearGlass, this will act as the new 'due date'.

<sup>\*</sup> The due date is usually 4 weeks after the request is sent, however, to allow Asset Managers adequate time to collate and publish cost data the due date will never be less than 12 weeks following the end of a requested reporting period e.g. For Calendar Year reporting periods it will not be due prior to 1st April.

# **Section 4 - Choosing the correct template**

PLEASE NOTE – The Cost Transparency Initiative (CTI) Templates are prescribed by the Pensions and Lifetime Savings Association (PLSA) in the UK and the Cost Transparency Standard (CTS) templates are prescribed by the Irish Pension Fund Association (IAPF) in Ireland.

ClearGlass do not control the templates, or the data that it is required that we collect. ClearGlass provides a service to the asset owners to collect the data on their behalf.

### Section 5 - Completing the templates for the first time

- ClearGlass have sent either the CTI or CTS templates depending on the domicile of the client making the data request, please ensure you complete the correct country's template.
- Automated reporting using a Machine-readable CTI/CTS Main Account Template is recommended, experience has shown that this method saves you time and money. You can expect to receive a request for cost data at least once a year from every pension fund client.
- If you are interested in using the machine-readable template please contact ClearGlass (assetmanager@clearglass.com) for a copy and we can walk you through the process.
- Submitting templates directly via the ClearGlass Platform not only avoids delay in submissions, but also ensures the quality of data uploaded.
  - The ClearGlass Platform has built-in quality controls which highlights any missing data at the time of submission.
  - This helps the asset manager provide fully completed templates in a timely manner.

# Section 6 - General notes for completion of the templates

- 1. Please ensure that the information is supplied for the client's requested dates (Period of Reporting). The most common mistake made is to fill in the template for the wrong reporting period.
- 2. Costs should be actual costs and not rounded-up.
- 3. The format of the template should not be changed, for instance do not add text in cells with numeric formatting.
- 4. What NOT to include
  - a. Costs relating to the acquisition of an investment that are capitalised as part of the assets on a fund's balance sheet and therefore not shown as a cost in the income statement/profit or loss account.
  - b. Portfolio company holding structure costs that are incurred and recognised at the holding structure level which sits a level below the fund. These are currently reported to investors as costs at the level of the investment vehicles and not charged to the fund. However, any amounts charged to the fund must be disclosed.
  - c. Detailed expenses relating to the underlying funds a Fund of Funds has invested in.
  - d. Valuation adjustments for lease incentives (and other matters) should not be included.
  - e. Capital expenditure to increase the value of a property should not be regarded as a cost item.
  - f. Ground and head rents are not expenses and therefore should not be included.
- 5. For pooled fund templates, include the percentage cost values from the templates, this is because costs in percentages always reflect annual rate and do not change with the investment period in which the client is invested in.
  - E.g. if the transaction costs in the template is 5% (per annum) and the client is invested in that fund for only 4 months then the costs in monetary value will be calculated as (Average client holding x 5%)/12 months) x 4 months.

# Section 7 – Pooled Funds How to complete the Main Account Template for Pooled Funds

- 1. For pooled funds the following cells should be **CLIENT HOLDING** level information;
  - Client name
  - Average Value of Client Holding Share
  - Class Name
  - Period of Report
  - Rebates (If the template is pooled fund data and if the client has any specific arrangement, it should be quoted here (rebate section). Its mandatory if it's pooled fund data and if there is a rebate.)
  - One-off cost (entry, exit, client FX costs) if monetary value, or not if percentage.
- 2. For pooled funds all other information should be provided at **SHARE CLASS** level.

#### **Account information section**

This section identifies the fund or investment mandate to which the data relates and the period covered by the report.

Client name	Enter the full legal name of the pension fund or asset owner.
	Average value of the <b>client's holding</b> in a pooled vehicle. You must enter the client's templates, unless explicitly stated, are to be provided at the fund level.
	This is how to calculate the average value of client holding for a 12-month reporting period.
	Make sure that the START and END dates, that match the Client's requested reporting period     (as advised to you by ClearGlass in the data request email).
	<ol><li>Sum up 12 consecutive month-end NAV valuations of the client's investment within the requested reporting period.</li></ol>
	3. Divide by 12.
	If the client has requested that you report for an annual period, you should always divide by 12 regardless of the client's investment period. This is to match their average holding (as if they had been invested the entire 12 months) to your fund's costs.
Average value of client holding	The only exception is in the case of fund launch or liquidation happening within the client's requested reporting period. E.g. the fund has only been live for 9 months, you'd calculate 9 x month ends NAVs divided by 9 months.

Sales	PROVIDE THIS AS POSITIVE FIGURE (Share class level)  The total consideration received from the sale of assets during the reporting period. Converted from base currency to reporting currency using the end of period valuation exchange rate. Additional analysis by asset class may be provided.	
Inflows	PROVIDE THIS AS POSITIVE FIGURE (Share class level)  Net inflow of new money to the fund during the period calculated across all share classes at each valuation point and then summed for each valuation point with net inflows over the year. Please note the assets should be filled in where asset allocation exists, providing data for both the start and the end of the reporting period.

#### **Portfolio Transaction Costs**

This section is intended to provide additional context for the transaction cost data. Data in this section should be annual rate, share class level percentages. Provide a detailed analysis of transaction costs which are defined as the costs incurred as a result of the acquisition and disposal of investments. Include indirect transaction costs incurred within underlying holdings of pooled vehicles.

Indirect transaction costs	funds, reflecting the costs those pooled funds incur when they buy and sell their underlying investments (look-through transaction costs). Less: anti-dilution offset	Amounts collected in the period from dilution levies and dilution adjustments (in the case of swinging prices) or the equivalent amounts in relation to the issue and cancellation prices of dual priced funds. ### **Ongoing Charges**

This section provides an analysis of ongoing charges and charges for other ancillary services. Where an asset manager has directed the client to the services of a third party, the asset manager should also report the costs of those services in this section.

#### **Incidental Costs**

This section comprises performance-related charges.

### **Lending and Borrowing Costs**

N.B **STOCK LENDING** appears at the base of the Template, but it helps to complete it now, as it feeds into the **LENDING AND BORROWING COSTS** section which comes next.

Investment trusts should be regarded as being pooled funds and their look through property expenses should be included here.

### **One-Off Costs**

This section identifies the investment mandate to which the data relates and the period covered by the report.

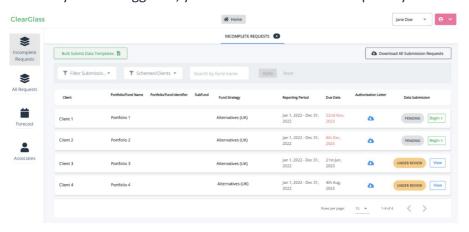

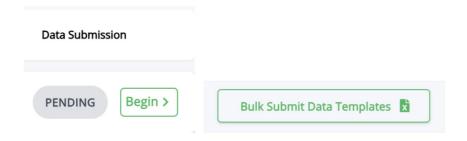

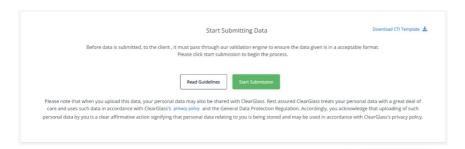
